



Showings – tips on how to prepare

We ask that, if possible, the home be vacant when we arrange a showing. Potential buyers feel more comfortable looking at a home when the owners aren't there. If someone has to be home please stay in one place to allow us to do our job. If you are asked a question, answer candidly and as succinctly as possible. Avoid asking questions of potential buyers.

Immediately before the showing

- › Have the radio on instrumental music playing softly
- › Pop something fragrant on or in the stove before a showing like simmering potpourri or an apple pie to give the kitchen a homey smell, don't cook foods with a lingering odour
- › Remove dishes and clear countertops.
- › Turn on all lighting during a showing and increase wattage for brightness
- › Keep room draperies and shades open to let in light and give the appearance of larger rooms
- › Remove laundry from the laundry room
- › Keep toys in children's rooms and remove any toys that may be scattered around the front yard
- › If possible, remove and replace items not included in the sale (i.e. chandelier) or tag items not included in sale (i.e. water softener)
- › If showing in the evening, turn on all exterior lights
- › Put pets in cages or take them to a friend or neighbour during the showing.
